PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

From the President's Desk:

May is one of the loveliest months of the year in the Shuswap and we hope this year is no exception. With spring heating things up, the gardens are in full bloom, golfers are hacking, pickle-ballers are batting and more people will be bowling bocce balls.

With our A.G.M. and volunteer appreciation evening behind us, we can turn our attention to what's coming up next at Cedar Social Centre. Early in the month we will have our famous Pig Roast on May 6th, with Dave Johnson's delicious BBQ recipe on tap. You have one day left to buy a ticket. For those who have already done so, enjoy!

Next up is our open house on May 11th to celebrate our 50th anniversary. You can refer to the next article for the details.

At about the same point, our golf course project will ramp up with reconstruction of holes #6, 7 and 8 greens on the upper area. The new greens will be larger, re-shaped and re-sloped to make play more enjoyable. During construction, golfers will be restricted to the lower golf area where holes #1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 9 are found.

Our ladies' group, "Chicks with Sticks", will start its weekly play shortly, and the men's "Match Play Series" will as well. Meanwhile, bocce will provide greater value with the combining of indoor carpet bowling in the Subscribe F

Over 50 members attended the Annual General Meeting of C.H.C.A. on April 8th . The board reported on a successful 2023 fiscal year, resulting in a surplus of over \$40,000. The treasurer reviewed the financial statements for 2023 and made motions to move several allotments of funds into reserve status for future capital expenditures. Thank goodness we have this surplus as the pickle ball court resurfacing will require over \$30,000 and the parking lot renewal over \$100,000 in the next few years. Earning a surplus each year is a necessity as grant funds are increasingly difficult to generate in the post-COVID era. The motions were passed.

Progress on various projects was reported and a demonstration of our new website received a very positive response from the audience. Several amendments to our constitution and bylaws arose from the Strategic Plan Review and were presented to the members in attendance. Following debate, all but one were passed, with the last one tabled until fall, following further review by the board.

Lastly, I closed the meeting with an announcement that I would not be standing for re-election at the Fall General Meeting. I wanted to announce this now to give our current board and members a lot of time to find a new president. After serving on the board since 2014, it's time to move on and for fresh perspectives to come from others to address the organization's future.

I want to thank all the volunteers at all levels for their tireless efforts to make Cedar Heights Community Association such a success and a community leader.

CEDAR HEIGHTS GOLF COURSE UPDATE

We are excited to announce that the course is now open, but with some upcoming closures.



It was a very nice winter for promoting the growth of snow mold and moss. The spots on the greens from the snow mold will disappear when it gets sunny but the moss has to be sprayed out with ferrous

sulphate. As a result, the greens will have dark patches as the moss dies off after the treatment, which should take place by the first week of May.

Around the second week of May, we will be aerating, re-seeding and sanding the greens on the lower level of the course. This should smooth out the parts of the greens formerly occupied by the moss and will aid the percolation of water into the root zone.

Beginning on May 6th, we will be rebuilding the first two greens on the upper level. Therefore the upper level will not be playable until well into July. We will be building two new tee boxes on the lower level to allow for nine distinct holes playing to just six greens in the meantime.

We will be aerating, spraying and fertilizing the lower level in early May as well, at which time the course will be closed for 24 hours. We will advise of the exact date when we know it; watch for reminders on the website, Facebook and

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All in all, we will be taking a short step back before we take the next big steps forward. In the meantime, do come out and play or just come and take a look at Area 7....grass should be starting to appear as soon as the weather warms.



Through the second and third weeks of May, we will need a small number of volunteers who can help with tee box construction and greens reconstruction. If you think you have time to help out, please send an e-mail to Dean's address, below. You will receive a call once we know our exact schedule of work on the course.

On the morning of Thursday, May 9th, we will be aerating and re-sanding the existing greens. If you can help out, please leave a message at (250) 675-4929 or send a note to <u>Dean.Wallace@shaw.ca</u>.

IT'S FIRE SEASON...AGAIN

The reports of early season wildfires are already coming in from around the province and

Alberta. The long-term weather forecast is for another hot and dry summer, so the potential for fires will be high. After last year's crisis, nobody is taking climate change and its consequences lightly anymore. One of the results of the studies of the 2023 wildfire season is the fact that flying embers were the cause of most of the structural ignitions. This makes the work of the FireSmart program personnel even more important. You don't have to clearcut the lovely trees that are so abundant in our area. What you need to do is protect your own home and other buildings from the embers that can ignite them.

We will be hosting another FireSmart information evening at the Cedar Heights Social Centre on May 29th. You can learn how to protect your property at a reasonable cost and even get financial assistance for your project. Make a note in your calendar. This will be the 3rd year in a row that we have hosted this event, and each time the audience doubles. After last year's experience, it should be a packed house. Get there early. It will start at 7:00 pm.

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
