FireSmart Day - Thursday Oct 16th

You may have noticed by the front door at the centre that Cedar Heights is recognized as a FireSmart Community. This has come about because of the dedicated efforts of our FireSmart volunteers, led by Blair Holmes, to ensure that Cedar Heights meets FireSmart standards everywhere in the 7.5 acres of land that we own. This year, CSRD again is contributing two bins that can be used by Cedar Heights, its members and our neighbours to dispose of compostable yard waste and materials from pruning activities.

Our primary goal this year is to carry out a light raking in many of the areas which previously were raked last year. This is intended to remove most of the cones, and small branches that have fallen over the past year. It is not intended to scour the grounds of all of the organics matter....so the raking should be considered as being light in nature. There may be a small amount of pruning on a few trees to remove lower branches. Any such pruning will be done by hand saw and without ladders.

If you are able to do light physical work (although some of it will be on uneven ground) on the morning of Thursday, October 16th, let me know by e-mail at Dean.Wallace@shaw.ca or by text/phone at (780) 995-3924.

A barbecue lunch will be served (and we are looking for helpers there as well).

For more information about how you can help us be a FireSmart leader in our area, please read the Help Wanted section of the Newsletter.

1. FireSmart Clean-up Day (Thursday October 16th morning and lunch)

- 10 grounds clean-up crew (mainly raking and moving raked up materials to our trailers)
- 2 sorters (to work through existing piles to eliminate material which cannot go in the FireSmart bins)
- 1 gatekeeper (to ensure that materials brought to our FireSmart bins by local residence are acceptable for composting)
 - 1 barbecue operator and 2 additional kitchen staff for lunch

2. OktoberFest (Saturday, October 25th afternoon and evening)

- Decorating crew at 2 pm 5 people for 1 to 2 hours
- 50/50 ticket seller(s) 2 people (sporadically from 5 pm to 8 pm)
- Kitchen help and pot-luck servers 5 people from 5 pm to 7 pm
- Tear-down crew Approximately 9 to 10 pm.
- Ticket sellers (bar and specialty food) 2 people (5 pm to 8:30 pm...with breaks for dinner and entertainment)

3. Enthusiastic singers

We are looking for five to ten people who only need to sing enthusiastically to encourage our Oktoberfest crowd in song on October 25th. There will be a couple of warm-up sessions in advance led by Peter Blacklock and George and Marie Gillis at dates and times yet to be determined.

4. Truck or trailer required

We are looking to clean up the area in the vicinity of our maintenance sheds. We have perhaps 2 tonnes of waste material such as small stumps, concrete posts, broken concrete, old irrigation pipe, construction materials, that needs to be transported to Skimikin.

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
