

Congratulations to Marjorie Lynn and Betsy Kutcha who recently passed their fitness practical exam and are teaching on a regular basis.














Tickets for the dinner go on sale Nov 4-25th. You can buy them online click **HERE** or at the office Tuesday or thursdays between 1-3 pm.

# BLIND BAY VILLAGE GROCER CARD PROGRAM

Did you know that if you buy a grocery card from Cedar Heights, the Village Grocer donates 8% of the value of the



card to our association? The revenue to Cedar Heights from the sale of \$60,000 of Blind Bay Village Grocer cards this year will pay for about 60% of our utilities costs. That is important to us.

We need to sell about \$25,000 worth of cards in the next two months to reach that target. The purchase of a BBVG card from Cedar Heights allows you to purchase any goods of equivalent value sold at BBVG including food, gas and alcohol products. To maximize the benefit to Cedar Heights, cards must be paid for in cash or by debit card. They are available in denominations from \$25 to \$500.

BBVG cards will be available for purchase at Cedar Heights on:

- In the office on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1 to 3 pm
- After Keep Fit on Friday, November 7<sup>th</sup>
- At the Artisan Market on Saturday, November 8<sup>th</sup>
- At the Bake Sale on Saturday, December 6<sup>th</sup>
- At all other special events for the remainder of the year.

So take the time to buy a card from us. If all of our members were to buy a \$200 card to cover purchases they were going to make at Blind Bay Village Grocers anyway, we would get \$16 from BBVG. This would go a long way to keeping the lights on at Cedar Heights.
